Earned a one-game recall to Pittsburgh on January 16.

**2008-09:** Began the season with Pittsburgh at the NHL Premiere in Stockholm, Sweden...Was assigned to Wilkes-Barre/Scranton on October 17...Was recalled by Pittsburgh on November 18... Appeared in three games with Pittsburgh, earning his first NHL win in relief of Dany Sabourin, a 5-3 victory November 26 @ NY Islanders...Earned his first NHL win as a starter, a 9-2 victory December 11 vs. NY Islanders...Was assigned to Wilkes-Barre/Scranton on December 12...Was named Reebok/AHL Player of the Week ending February 8, after going 3-0-0 while stopping 80 of 84 shots (1.30 GAA, .952 save percentage) and running his personal win streak to a career-best eight games...Won 11 consecutive games from January 18-February 20, setting a new team record...Became the first Penguins netminder to post back-to-back 20 win seasons, making 20 saves in a 3-2 victory against Hamilton on February 14... Tied the Penguins team record for wins in a season by a goaltender (Dany Sabourin - 30), stopping 26 shots in a 5-2 win March 28 vs. Toronto...Set the new team record for wins in a season with his 31st, also earning his fourth shutout of the season, in a 1-0 win March 29 @ Hershey...Appeared in a total of 50 games with Wilkes-Barre/Scranton, compiling a record of 33-15-1 with four shutouts, 2.38 GAA, and .916 save percentage...Tied for second in the league in wins and tied for seventh in shutouts...Became the Penguins all-time regular-season wins leader (57), passing Sebastien Caron (48)...
